We are growing and eager to serve more youth and their families in 2025. The success of our Council would not be possible without the volunteers and families that invest in Scouting through their time, talents and treasures.

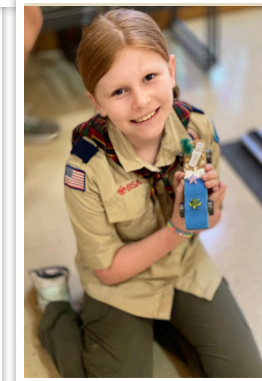

## A YEAR OF GROWTH

We grew in both youth membership and total Scouting units for the third consecutive year. Since COVID, we've increased by 11 percent cumulatively. To support this growth, we expanded our staff to enhance volunteer service and build capacity for continued membership growth.

We grew our Scoutreach membership by 62 percent last year, increasing from 386 youth members to 627 youth members in underserved communities throughout our region.

Our Exploring workforce development programs grew by 42 percent, thanks to partnerships with organizations like Truist, Capitol Broadcasting Company, The Durham Bulls, The North Carolina Highway Patrol, and Wake Tech. Exploring provides hands-on, real-world experiences for students, offering them a glimpse into the opportunities and challenges that exist in a particular field.





## SUMMERTIME ADVENTURES

Scouts BSA summer camp at Camp Durant was a massive success, welcoming 1,100+ youth during four week-long sessions. With outstanding feedback on our camp programs and facilities, we are excited to build even greater outdoor experiences in 2025.

Our Sea Scouts sailed in Commodore's Cup race at Camp LeJeune, and participated in unforgettable 8-day High Adventure cruise from Oriental to Cape Lookout Lighthouse.

## WINTER

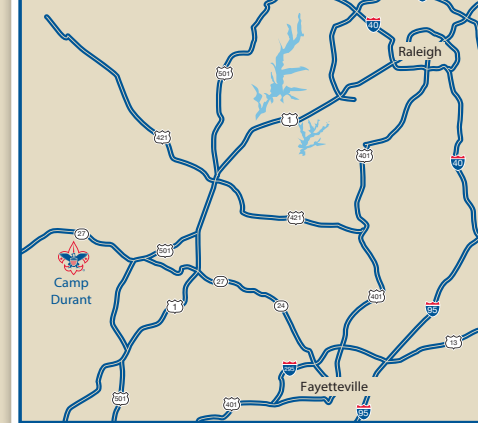
700 Scouts braved the cold for an action-packed weekend of merit badge classes at Winter Blast.

- 2,800 STEM-related merit badges earned, blending innovation with outdoor experiences.
- 375 adult volunteers completed leadership training, ensuring our Scouts receive the best possible guidance.

## A YEAR OF PHILANTHROPY & COMMUNITY SUPPORT

**IN 2024, OUR PHILANTHROPY COMMITTEE SECURED \$1.3 MILLION IN NEW ENDOWMENT GIFTS, WHICH RANKED US 2ND AMONG 236 SCOUTING AMERICA COUNCILS ACROSS THE NATION.**



We hosted several other fundraising events.
