Camp Facts

Medical Needs

Unit Leaders/Scouts are responsible for administering medications and keeping said medications located in a secure place. Refrigeration, if required, is available at the Health Lodge. There will be a staff medic to assist with medical emergencies. The camp utilizes 911 services for Moore County. BSA health forms should be kept in camp by Unit Leaders.

Refunds

After class registration occurs, if refunds are needed, please contact Lauri Gillie (laureen.gillie@scouting.org).

Cancellation

In the event that state or local guidelines change, pandemic conditions change, or the Occoneechee Council cancels the event for any other reason, refunds will be issued.

Leaving Camp/Visitors

For your protection, all campers (youth and adult) who leave camp must check out with the Camp Office. If a camper must leave camp and is picked up by a parent or guardian, a driver's license must be provided to the camp office in order for that camper to leave. If any participant leaves camp during the weekend, he or she is not allowed to re-enter camp. No visitors will be allowed on site during the event.

Parking

All vehicles must be parked at the Admin parking lot near the camp entrance. Units are permitted to take one vehicle and/or trailer to their assigned campsites for their convenience. Handicap driving passes will be handled on a case-by-case basis.

Tobacco

In accordance with National BSA policy, and as outlined in the Guide to Safe Scouting, the use of tobacco on the Occoneechee Scout Reservation is prohibited.

Drugs and Alcohol

The BSA prohibits the use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances at encampments or activities on property owned and operated by the BSA.

Emergencies

In the event that an emergency is declared, a camp-wide siren will be signaled, and everyone will be required to report to their unit campsite. Leaders should account for all members and wait for further instruction from event staff.

Frequently Asked Questions



When does class registration begin and end on Tentaroo?

Begins March 1, 2020 at 9:00 a.m.

What are the prerequisites and course requirements?

All course information can be found by clicking on the name of the Merit Badge found here: [April Spring Blast Course Pages](#)

Will Scouts be guaranteed their first choice of classes?

No, but we hope that by offering a wide variety of classes, there will be multiple options to fit every scout's needs.

Where are scouts expected to be when they are not in class?

We hope all scouts will be taking merit badge classes for all sessions. If a scout does not have a class, he or she will be expected to be in the troop's assigned campsite. Due to COVID restrictions, the Grand Lodge will not be open and all indoor spaces available will be used for courses. Scouts and units should be prepared to have unit members in their campsite when not in another assigned space. This includes unit oversight which adheres to BSA Youth Protection policies.

Will the number of scouts be limited?

The total number of scout participants in camp will be limited to 400. Slots will be filled on a first paid, first served basis. No registration will be complete until paid in full. Classes sizes will be limited.

Will there be limits on the number of leaders a unit may bring to camp?

Yes, in order to follow COVID capacity limits for the camp, there will be a limit of two adults per unit who are not instructors or Winter Blast staff.

When are registrations finalized?

Registration will not be final until paid in full.

Will there be any camp wide activities?

No camp wide activities are planned. Opening, Closing, and Flag Ceremonies may be held by each unit in their campsite. There will be no camp wide ceremonies or vesper services.

What are the departure times?

Units should depart camp Sunday by 6:00 p.m. All campsites and bathhouses should be cleaned and fires out cold before departing.

Classes will be held throughout camp; personal schedules will include locations.

How are campsites assigned?

Campsites will be assigned by camp staff based on unit size

Will there be a working sink in the campsite?

All campsites will have open bathhouses including sinks, toilets, and showers.



How are meals being handled? All meals are to be provided by the unit for its members. Units should be prepared to cook their meals in the unit's campsite.

How will Unit Leaders receive communication from staff during the weekend?

We are working on a messaging system. Details will be provided at check-in.

What if we have questions during the weekend?

Winter Blast staff will be at the Grand Lodge to assist unit leaders when needed. Please knock if we can help you. Scouts should go to their unit leaders for assistance.

Will there be any meetings on Friday night?

Yes, there will be mandatory safety classes for Pistol Training and ATV

Will other information be communicated to unit leaders?

There will be virtual meetings for Scoutmasters, SPLs, and Instructors prior to April 1. Further information on those will be sent to troops in advance.
